

Landscape Management Plans Now in the Landscape Analysis Tool

Effective May 31, 2018, after business hours, Landscape Management Plans will be incorporated into the Landscape Analysis Tool (LAT).

What is this change about?

Landscape Management Plans provide opportunities to guide the extent, rate, and duration of footprint. They ensure continued access to resources while protecting environmental values and supporting and complementing regional objectives.

The LAT will use spatial data to identify Landscape Management Plans in the LAT report.

Depending on the content of the Landscape Management Plan and the proposed purpose/activity and disposition type, the applicant may have certain requirements to meet and considerations to take into account prior to and/or at the time of application.

Why did this change occur?

Having Landscape Management Plans forming part of the LAT report increases transparency and awareness of the management of footprint to contribute to biodiversity and watershed objectives for both applicants and staff.

How will applicants benefit from this change?

Applicants will be able to identify exactly which Landscape Management Plans are to be consulted when preparing their applications to inform the content of their application and identify any key strategies that may be employed to meet the objectives of the plans.

Note: Applicants wishing to submit existing LAT reports as part of their application will still be required to consult Landscape Management Plans when preparing their applications.
