

Outdoor Recreation Checklist

Use this checklist to get ready
for a safe and enjoyable trip.

CAMPFIRE:

- Check for fire bans and dry conditions
- Firewood (may not be provided)
- Firestarter (do not use lighter fluid or gasoline)
- Water and large bucket
- Fire built in safe place:
 - In fire pit
 - On sand, gravel or clay
 - Away from debris that can burn
 - Away from structures and equipment

BEARSMART:

- Garbage bags
- Airtight storage container for food
- All food and pet food stored in vehicle (not tents or tent trailers)
- Flashlight
- Pet leash
- Bear spray (view Proper Use of BearSpray on YouTube)

If you have children, keep them close. View a Bear Smart Campsite on YouTube.

RESPECT THE LAND

- Garbage bags
- Pack out and dispose of garbage and sewage properly
- Trail map that shows bridges and approved water crossings
- Permission from landowner or lease holder before entering

Share trails and avoid wet areas.

WEATHER

- Proper sleeping bag
- Warm clothes
- Rain gear
- Sturdy shoes or boots

- Sunscreen
- Sunhat

Make sure the area is dry enough for your activity.

HEALTH

- First aid kit
- Water
- Insect repellent
- Phone and emergency contact
- Family or friends know where you are and when you are coming back
- Fully charged cell phone

Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV)

- Licence plate, registration and insurance
- Working headlight and tail lights
- Working muffler
- Spark arrester
- Helmet with face and eye protection
- Full coverage clothing
- OHV training

It is illegal for anyone under age 14 to operate an OHV on public lands without adult supervision. No person under 16 years old should operate an adult OHV. Make sure your child or youth is riding an OHV that is appropriate for their age, weight and maturity. Follow manufacturers' recommendations, and ensure children and youth wear helmets and other safety gear when operating or riding an OHV.

GET THERE SAFELY

- Seat belts for all passengers. Buckle up.
- Designated driver. If you drink, don't drive.
- Child safety seats for children under six years/18 kg (40 lb).
- Booster seats for children over 18 kg (40 lb).
- GPS or compass
